1. Purves' Craigmount Inca, 10 y.o. tri., masculine head, dark eye, straight front, deep chest, level topline & good rear quarters. Handled & moved well.
 2. Parkin's Flurries Brigand, 7 y.o., masculine head with good eye, deep chest, level topline & good quarters. Moved OK.
- MPD(4,1)
1. Calikes' Newlin Flint, 6 mos. smart broken tri. with nicely shaped head, dark eye and long leathers. Super neck into correct shoulders, good front, level topline and good bone throughout. Well angulated quarters providing drive on the move.
 2. Smith & Starbrook's Koorbrats Watchful, 6 mos. t/w with nice head, deep chest, good shoulders & level topline. Moved OK.
 3. McGiffen's Rhiconich Kirk.
- PD(6,1)
1. Lomax's Lowyck Sundance, t/w with masculine head, good eye & pigmentation, straight front, good bone throughout, level topline, stern well set on. Moved well using good rear quarters. BPD & BPIS
 2. Newlin Flint
 3. Lomax's Lowyck Snowstorm
- JD(2)
1. Lomax's Lowyck Snowstorm, t/w litter brother of JD winner & similar comments apply. However, I preferred the movement of Sundance.
 2. Brannan & Kelly's Dapperdawg Forbidden Isle, compact tri. with nice head & good eye, straight front, good shoulders, perhaps lacking a little muscle in hind quarters. Moved OK.

1. Lowyck Sundance.
 2. Fallon & Watson's Newlin Anchor Chief, sound t/w of good size & proportions. Preferred the head of 1. Nice neck & shoulders, deep chest & level topline with correct tail set. Strong quarters, moved soundly.
 3. Walker's Molesend Magician at Barughgreen.
- LD(5)
1. MacDonald's Fallowfield Fusion of Finmorlan, tri. with pleasing head, good eye & expression, straight front, nice neck & shoulders, level topline & stern set on. Ample bone. Moved well in all directions. RBD

2. Goldberg's Molesend Adrift, tri. mottle with nice head & kind expression & long leathers. Good bone throughout, deep chest & strong quarters. Covered the ground well when moved.
3. Findlay's Rhiconich Chico.
- OD(4) 1. Bailey's Newlin Victor of Salenko, t/w with good masculine head, eye & expression & low set leathers. Good reach of neck into well placed shoulders & straight front. Ample bone throughout, deep chest & strong hind quarters which provided drive when moved. Loved the free movement, well handled. BD & BIS
2. MacDonald's Fallowfield Duce of Finmorlan, t/w with pleasing well domed head & good eye. Deep chest, level topline and strong rear quarters. Moved OK.
3. Fraser's Miskin Lewis at Wyvisview
- VB(7,1) 1. Dean's Ch.& Ir.Ch.Gempeni Wildflower, what more can be said about this 13 y.o. lady that hasn't been said before. Broken tri. with lovely head & eye, good reach of neck into correct shoulders, deep chest, good bone & strong quarters. Pleasure to watch on the move. BVIS
2. Purves' Craigmount Honeydew, 11 y.o. t/w with good head, eye & pigmentation. Ample bone & nicely constructed throughout. Moved & handled well.
3. Goldberg's Molesend Mitzi
- MPB(7,1) 1. MacDonald's Rossut Rhapsody, smart broken tri. with nice feminine head, good eye, neck & shoulders, deep chest level topline, well boned & strong quarters. Moved well. I liked a lot but unfortunate to meet winner of PB in the challenge.
2. Findlay's Rhiconich Lucy, sound compact blanket tri. with pleasing head & expression. Ample bone throughout for size but I preferred the front of 1. Moved OK.
3. Fraser's Wyvisview Volante.
- PB(6) 1. Folwell & Theobald's Orchidvale Flamboyant, beautiful & compact broken tri. with an appealing head & dark eye, straight front, deep chest & level topline with stern well set on. Moved with drive. BPB
2. Hill's Dapperdawg Island Mist, t/w with feminine head, kind eye & expression. Good reach of neck, correct shoulders, straight front & super rear quarters. Good mover. Should not be disappointed with placing in this class.
3. Binks' Tannahill Roxy
- JB(6.1) 1. Binks' Tannahill Indigo, smart blanket tr. with pleasing feminine head, dark eye & long low set leathers. Good neck & shoulders, level topline with ribs well sprung. Moved soundly.
2. Hill's Dapperdawg Island Mist
3. Calikes' Balgowan Tiger Lilly
- PGB(9,3) 1. Goldberg's Newlin Chalice at Molesend, first saw this t/w at just 6 mos. & have watched her since from the ringside. Pleased to go over her for first time & found a pleasing feminine head with good eyes & soft expression, long reach of neck, good shoulder placement, straight front, level topline & correct set of stern. Good bone

throughout with strong rear quarters. Moved well with freedom. Unfortunate to meet her sire in the ultimate challenge. BB & RBIS

2. MacDonald's Newlin Zoe of Finmorlan, broken tri. with pleasing head, dark eye & nice expression. Good reach of neck, deep chest, level topline & good angulation. Moved well.

3. Butters & Theobald's Orchidvale Blossom of Breskar

LB(3)

1. Dean's Barterhound Bouquet for Gempeni, broken tri. with lovely head, dark expressive eyes & long low set leathers. Super reach of neck into well placed shoulders, straight front, tight feet, deep chest, level topline & strong rear quarters. Very sound in movement. Close call for BB but felt that my PGB winner just had the edge in forward reach. RBB

2. Walker's Sabinhay Philigree at Barughgreen, larger type with a strong head, dark eye & low set long leathers, deep chest, good bone throughout & strong quarters. Moved well.

3. Hill's Dapperdawg Heart of Kaos

OB(6,1)

1. Goldberg's Molesend Butterfly, nicely balanced broken tri. of good size, pleasing head & expression, lovely arched neck into good shoulders, deep chest, level topline, correct tail set & well muscled quarters. Moved with purpose.

2. Butters & Theobald's Orchidvale Angelica of Breskar, very feminine in head with dark eye & long leathers, good reach of neck, well placed shoulders, level topline & good rear construction. Moved well.

3. Hill's Bruadair Cno-Challtainn von Dapperdawg

Brace(2)

1. MacDonald's, well matched pair of broken tris., subsequently learnt that they were not related. Moved well together.
